Certificate for Long-Term Care Session

This certificate is issued by NICN in collaboration with Nebraska ICAP and Nebraska DHHS Epidemiology Unit, and it is valid for three years.

The post-test will be administered at the conclusion of Day 2 Long-Term Care Facilities session. It is comprised of 25 questions, with a passing score of 80 percent. There is no additional cost for taking the post-test or to receive the certificate. If you desire to take the post-test, mark the appropriate box on the registration form.
